Tentative Schedule Announced; Raleigh May Be Replaced By Salisbury.

Greensboro High school's 1938 grid-iron aggregation will face a 10-game schedule of formidable opponents, including three conference clashes, with a possibility that another loop foe will be added before next fall.



The schedule, released yesterday by Bob Jamieson, athletic director and coach of the eleven, lists Raleigh High on September 23, but more than likely the Capitol City team will be replaced by Boyden High, of Salisbury.

Charlotte High' Wildcats have withdrawn from the Western conference race, but will be met under the lights of Memorial Stadium on the night of October 14 in one of the outstanding home tilts of the season.

NETMEN WIN STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

Lewis Has Successful Season As New Coach of Net Squad.

Clinching the state championship by virtue of an undefeated season, the G. H. S. tennis team completed the first campaign under the able leadership of Carlyle Lewis who replaced Frank Johnson as coach.

The members of the team and a brief resume of their past records follows: Stokes Rawlins, who played number one man throughout the year, has been a member of the team for three years and has held down the top position for the past two seasons. He was defeated in three of eight conference matches, but this is an admirable record in view of the fact that his opponents have been the best in the realms of high school tennis.

Jay Shepherd, number three man, and Ed Gehrke, number two man, have only one blot on their conference records. They are to be commended for the splendid fight they gave in the doubles finals for state championship at Chapel Hill.

Charlie Baker, who holds down number four position, has been a member of the team for two years. He has the same record as Stokes, with three losses against five wins.

Clyde Fields and John Tate, who round out the six players on the team, have also been very successful in their fights with other players, dropping only one match out of eight.

Although this season has been one of the most successful in the history of tennis at Senior High, the prospects for next year's team are not as bright as might be hoped for, since three of the six lettermen will be graduated.

However, with Shepherd, Tate, and Fields returning to vie for berths, Coach Lewis will have a fine foundation for next year's net aggregation.
