## GHS JUNIOR ENGINEERS CLUB OPENS ACTIVITIES WITH WUNC-TV PROGRAM

Senior's Junior Engineers Club opened the year's activities Monday, September 30, by inaugurating their 1957-58 television program series over WUNC-TV, Channel 4 when Ronnie Price, senior, and Max Snodderly presented the first program on the theory of heat and cold.

Their programs will be presented on alternate Monday nights from 9-9:30. Members of the club will give all of the programs, aided by the advice of S. L. Whitely and D. A. Upstill, on the basis of three programs of a topic. The programs topics for the first semester include heat and cold, metals, the electro-magnetic spectrum, and aspects of space.

Programs at club meeting are on the same basis, with the exception that an engineer from the Pomona Engineers Club sponsors for Junior Engineers, will give every third program.

The first three programs on the topic of heat and cold are the responsibility of Max Snodderly, senior. Rufus Russell and Jim Sawers, seniors are in charge of the next two series, respectively. Jerry Kennon, senior, is the club member responsible for supervising the entire year's programs extending on into May.

Comprising the bulk of the remaining activities for the year are Science Day and Science Fair. The former is an assembly program presented by Junior Engineers to the student body and the latter is a contest in which science students enter projects. Junior Engineers cooperates with the Science Department in staging the fair.
