Value of Scholarship

The scholarships are valued at 1500 per year for a four year period, provided the recipient maintains satisfactory standards scholarship and deportment.

Approximately 200 prospective college students, most of them high school seniors in the Greensboro area, took the College Baard Examination at Greensboro Sen-ior High School, January 11.

The College Board Examination is one of the most widely used entrance qualifying tests and is prerequisite for entrance to any branch of the University of North

The General Assembly of North Carolina has set up a "Scholar-ship Loan Fund for Prospective Teachers". This loan applies to those Seniors who might be in-terested in teaching. The Loan Fund is administered by the State Board of Education and the State Superintendent of Public Instruc-tion at Raleigh.
