

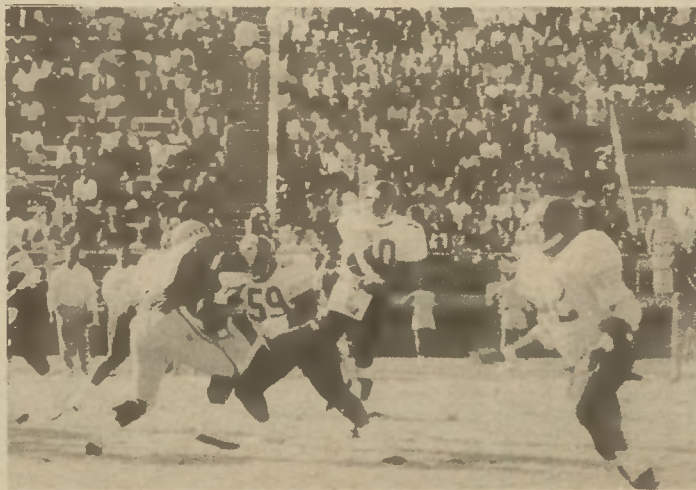
# Harvey, Eagles To Take Flight No. 10

James Earl "Air" Harvey is 285 yards from becoming the all-time leading passer in the history of the NCAA Division II. Harvey, a strapping 6-3 205 quarterback from Fayetteville's Douglas Byrd High School, has brought national notoriety to North Carolina Central and CIAA. He is the first player in the history of the NCAA to throw for over 3000

pass completions in 1254 pass attempts. "Air" has rushed for 16 touchdowns and has been responsible for 80 touchdowns. That total is 16 short of the mark held by Doug Williams of Grambling State.

Tenth year head coach Henry C. Lattimore will be searching for the CIAA crown this year. His Eagles won the 1980 title and should be a very ex-

pected to come into his own. He was fifth in receiving last year with 22 catches for 374 yards and a td. Sophomore split end Reese Hargrove had 25 receptions for 382 yards. He had a 53 yard reception against Fayetteville State. Red-shirt freshman Greg Lewis is expected to step in and fill the shoes of two-time ALL-CIAA tight end Terrence McNeill. Junior fullback Gary Leath, the second leading receiver on the team, had 29 catches for 338 yards and 2 tds last year. He

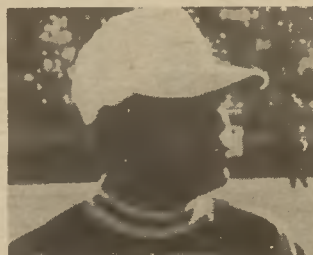


Harvey makes an attempt to cool off after passing for yet another score in a victory over Alan Hooker and the A&T Aggies last season.

yards as a freshman. He enters his final season having completed 529 of 1091 passes for 8252 yards and 64 touchdowns. He has been intercepted 58 times. Harvey has 8266 total offensive yards and needs 120 to become the NCAA Division II career leader. Harvey holds four NCAA Division II career records—total offensive plays in the three years (1542); total offensive yards in three years (8266); most games passing for 300 or more yards in a game (13); and most consecutive games throwing a touchdown pass (21). His next 200+ passing game will tie the Division II record of 25 held by Dave DenBraber of Ferris State (1984-'7). DenBraber also holds career stands of 661

citing unit. This season will find the Eagles with no ALL-CIAA receiver for the first time in five seasons. However, NCCU possesses a fine receiving corps. Senior flanker Joe Vanhook is

led 8 receptions for 117 yards against North Carolina A&T State in the season finale. Senior David Burt averaged 4.9 yards per carry in picking up 335 yards on 73 rushes.

The Eagles suffered losses of three starters on the offensive wall. Seniors Kenneth Guidry (6-1 303 Galveston, TX) and

Willie Buckley (6-1 290 Homestead FL) will anchor the unit. Juniors Anthony sterling (6-0 300 Charlotte, NC) and Brian McCorkle (6-0 237 Charlotte, NC) will compliment Guidry and Buckley.

Defensively, NCCU returns five senior starters. Fred Dunston 220 Fayetteville, NC) moves inside and will be joined by Rodney Edmonds (5-9 225 So Charlotte). The other lineman are expected to

be John McNair (6-2 202 So DE Laurinburg, NC), Willie Holmes (6-0 275 Fr Galveston, TX)

and Thomas Dixon (6-2 240 So DE Raleigh, NC).

Massey, a first team ALL-CIAA cornerback, led the Eagles with 6 in-

terceptions of 81 yards. He had a 69 yard scoring return against Virginia Union.

Mack had 4 steals for 77 yards and Lindsey picked off 2 passes for

16 yards. Harry Fuller, a junior from Charlotte, had 3 interceptions for 80 yards and one score.
