Faculty, staff and students all come together for a week of talent contests, fashion shows and art exhibitions during University Week, April 6 - 10.

Works by well-known artist Jacob Lawrence go on exhibit in the Diggs Gallery on April 21.

The university observes its 100th Commencement on May 2. The invited speaker is the Honorable Douglas Wilder, Governor of Virginia.

A third art exhibition, "Improvisation in the Found Object in the Work of African-American Visionary Artist," opens in the Diggs Gallery on September 21, 1992.

Homecoming '92 will be observed September 23-27, with a Centennial Gala and Dinner being held on September 25 - three days shy of the university's actual founding. The festivities include

entertainment by alumni - professional vocalists and musicians - and special recognition of past and present chief administrators.

On September 26, Winston-Salem State University will play the traditional homecoming football game against Livingstone College, where founder Dr. Simon Green Atkins once taught.

An educational forum on November 18, featuring nationally-known educators, will discuss "Black Colleges and Universides—A National Treasure," which will be broadcast on public television.

The closing centennial event includes placement of a time capsule and a flag-lowering ceremony.

Today, Winston-Salem State University is one of 16 constituent members of The University of North Carolina and one of five historically-black UNC schools. It offers more than 30 bachelor's degree programs, among them education, business, accounting, economics, computer science and nursing. Masters degrees are offered through the university's Graduate Center in cooperation with other UNC campuses. Recently, physical therapy was approved as a major, with the first students entering the program by spring 1992.
