Named after the university's first African-American dean, John B. Ervin Scholarships are awarded based on academic merit, leadership and commitment to community service.

Ervin scholars participate in a program designed especially for them, including orientation to Washington University, meetings with university and community leaders, academic support and advising, assistance in finding research and internship positions, and events with other Ervin Scholars and program administrators. They are expected to participate in a variety of campus activities and community service projects.

It places students in entry-level positions to record, music distribution and publishing companies, TV and radio stations, entertainment retail stores, film companies, law firms, trade publications and other related business. Students get to develop job skills through hands-on experience behind the scenes.
