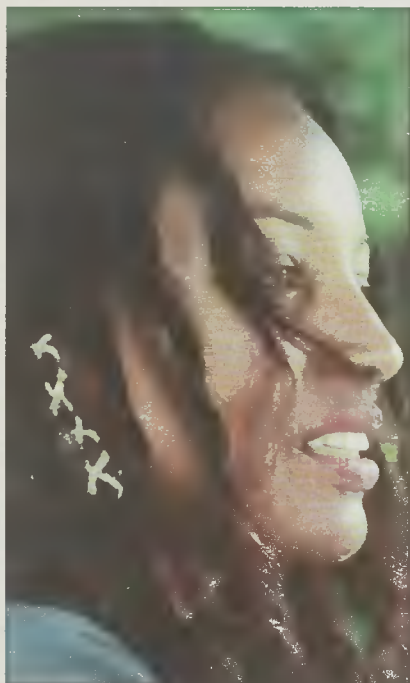


ART IN MOTION

Many of you may remember, "The Phoenix", a spectacular hundred-foot oil on canvas mural painted by Glenda Wharton while she was a student at the North Carolina School of the Performing Arts. Think of those images, symbols, and figures walking, talking, and flying and you will have some idea of her wonderful new work-in-progress, "The Zo and The Invisible Friend".

"The Zo and the Invisible Friend" will be a 35mm hand-drawn and painted short film. It is the story of an abused child kept in a magical house by a monster called the Zo. It is a story of abuse and survival. "The Zo" is all hand drawn and painted and Glenda may be the only person in
