Several members of the Theta Gamma chapter are planning to attend the spring Illysinium at the University of Tennessee.

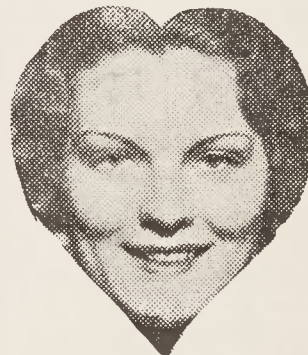
## Kappa Delta
