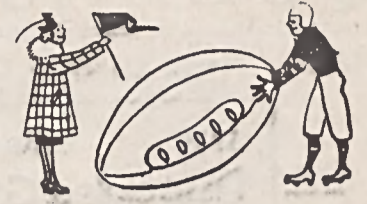

Mrs. Violet Young Gentry of Manhasset, New York, national inspector of Alpha Delta Theta national social fraternity, was the guest of the local chapter at Queens-Chicora college this week from Tuesday at noon until Thursday when she left to inspect Alpha Alpha chapter at the College of Charleston in Charleston, S. C.

On Wednesday she held conferences with the various members of the local chapter and on Wednesday night a feed was given for her, following the completion of inspection.

Mrs. Gentry is chairman of the National Pan-Hellenic Congress, being the delegate from Alpha Delta Theta. She is chairman also of the national expansion committee of the sorority. Mrs. Gentry was one of the founders of Alpha Delta Theta, which was founded at Transylvania College in Lexington, Kentucky, in 1919. At present there are twenty-six chapters.

## Designer Is Speaker Here

Miss Emma B. Hopkins, interior designer of New York City, was guest speaker during the regular chapel program in the Queens-Chicora college auditorium on Saturday morning, October 8.

Mrs. Esther Wright Huffman, head of the art department of the college, introduced Mrs. Osmond L. Barringer of Charlotte, who presented Miss Hopkins. Miss Hopkins' topic of discussion was "Taste, Form, and Restraint in a College Girl's Life."

She pointed out that in conversation we are unable to determine the college degree possessed by our partner in conversation, but that we are able to tell whether or not that person has developed taste from his college education.

Miss Hopkins emphasized the importance of developing taste in arrangement of a room, the tone of the speaking voice, and the selection of clothes, especially, although it is needed in other things, also.

In conclusion Miss Hopkins said, "Taste is a thing that doesn't just happen, and you can't start too soon to develop it."

Miss Hopkins is noted in her line of work with her own studio in New York, from where she plans to open a branch in Charlotte with Mrs. Barringer in charge. She has been associated with the Todhunter school in New York and Barnard College, Columbia University, where she designed the dean's home and various college rooms and parlors. Her pine panel study was named the best study in New York last year. She spoke at the Mint Museum in Charlotte on October 1.

Those tapped include Miss Grace Robinson and Miss Thelma Albright, faculty members; Sara Durant of Newton, Iowa, Anne Fuller of Buffalo, Ala., Georgia Hurt and Annie Mae Brown of Charlotte.

Eleanor Alexander of Knoxville, Tenn., presided over the service. Dr. W. H. Frazer read for the devotional from the twelfth chapter of Romans, after which the Lord's Prayer was prayed. Miss Alexander then gave a brief resume of the history of the organization and its purpose. Mrs. James Huntington played "Largo" on the organ during the entire service.

Miss Robinson is head of the voice department of the college, director of the Choral Club, and adviser for the local chapter of Alpha Delta Pi.
