- 7. Any undesirable conduct on the part of the team or member of the team may forfeit the game to the opposite team or be dealt with by the commissioner.
- 8. The officials will be selected by the commissioner for each game.
- 9. All classes must pay a fee of two dollars to participate in the game.
- 10. All line-ups should be in to the official score keepers at least the day before game day.
