

ACC GAMES RECALLED: CLEMSON WINS

On Monday of last week, all ACC tournament games were recalled when it was found that all of them were refereed illegally.

The games, closed to the public for security reasons, were played every day since Tuesday night.

The first game, between South Carolina and Duke, resulted in a win for South Carolina. This pitted them against Virginia, who won over Carolina the same night. After making a spectacular show, and winning over Virginia in the last ten seconds of the game by four points, South Carolina went to the finals.

Meanwhile, State and Wake Forest fought it out at the Charlotte Coliseum and Wake Forest came out on top. They played Clemson and were easily beaten by them. All officials had rated the Tigers highly and were not surprised at the score 50-27. On Saturday night, Clemson scored 86 over Maryland's 64 and went to the finals with USC.

The game started with a fast four points for South Carolina. As Clemson sleepily dribbled and lost the ball time after time, South Carolina quickly gained 23 points. By the end of the quarter the score stood at 27-4.

At this point in the game, Coach Frank McGuire of the USC Gamecocks went out to talk to reporters.

At the sight of him the Tigers became infuriated and, back on the court, gained control of the ball and soon scored 22 points. A free throw evened the score at the end of the half.

One Gamecock substitute was put in the game for the second half, and three Tigers.

South Carolina was astonished when Clemson, with a dazzling display of basketball, sank basket after basket, and managed to continually elude John Roche and his team.

Coach McGuire, numbed by the turn of events was found, out cold, behind the Clemson bench. He was easily revived when a maroon and white lollipop was waved under his nose. But, by this time, the Tigers had outscored South Carolina by 74 points, and when the Clemson band struck up "Tiger Rag" Coach McGuire promptly fainted once more.

With three seconds left in the game, a jump ball was called between Coakely and Owens. Owens, with glazed eyes, tipped the ball off to Joyce, who made a fantastic shot from half court. The basket made the score 29 for South Carolina, and 101 for Clemson, an amazing victory.

The band gave a beautiful rendition of the "Tiger Rag" as Bates Locke helped drag the unconscious McGuire off the gym floor.

McGUIRE ADMITS TRICKERY
