Summer School To Be Taught Here

Summer school for students of Johnston County will be held at Smithfield High School from Thursday, June 13, through Thursday, August 11. There will be no charge. Students may register on Saturday, June 8; Monday, June 10; and Tuesday, June 11, from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Each student must furnish his own transportation.

The courses offered in summer school are make-up courses and enrichment courses. No person in Smithfield High can take two Englishes in one year if he should fail English. All four years of English are offered in the make-up courses.

Students may audit classes for no credit. They will, however, be expected to attend all classes and participate in all activities, tests, etc.

The make-up courses offered are the following: English I, II, III, IV; Algebra I, II; General Math; World History; U. S. History; Physical Science; Biology; and Typing I.

The enrichment courses which are offered are: Creative Writing; Reading Improvement; Geometry; Chemistry; Physics; French I and III; and Latin III.
