GREENSBORO — "The problem of race is not only one of the most important considerations in international matters today, but at the same time holds out the greatest promise for the future."

The speaker discussed our treatment of the Indian in terms of the fact that the bulk of Latin American population is partly Indian in the Caribbean area.

"In sending a Jim Crow army to all parts of the world," he stated, "America has made a tragic miscalculation. This is the worst kind of miscalculation that has ever been done."

Prof. Martin expressed the fear that American efforts to abolish imperialism might be stopped by the argument that we ourselves are imperialists.
