

SALE OF REAL ESTATE FOR TAXES

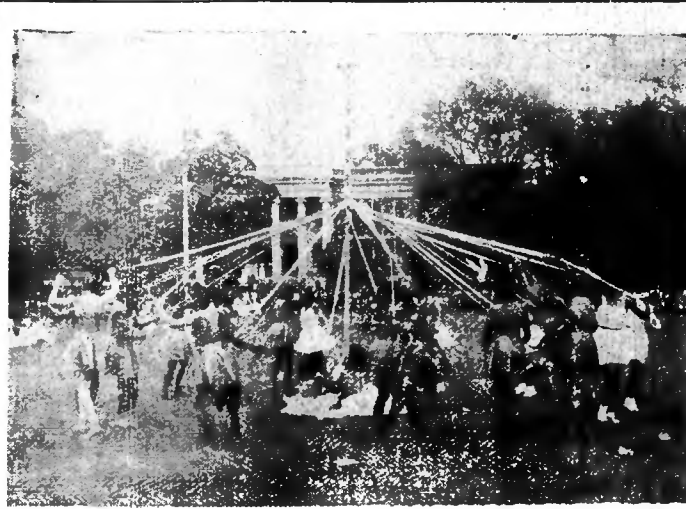

He is a native of Charleston, S. C., and received his education at Avery Institute, Howard University, Columbia University and Union Theological Seminary.
