She was married to Needham Lewis in 1917.

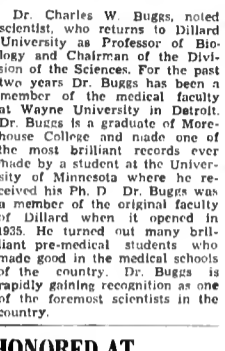
