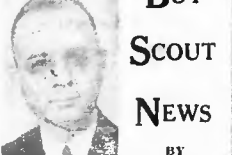

Executive of Occaneechee Council to Speak to the Moore County Schoolmaster's Club

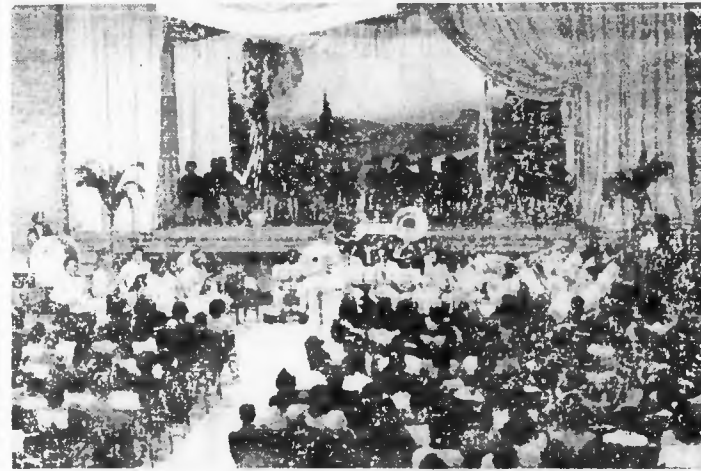
