## Hon. Thad Eure Makes Statement To Carolinian on Student Assembly Position

IRVING (Special To THE CAROLINIAN) RALEIGH — "Quote me on this Negro newspaper" publishers, leaders of the Negro race or any member of the race, with the exception of a public servant, because I choose, in the recent Student Legislative Assembly, to express my personal conviction, so that they are attempting to smear or build up a reputation against one of their friends, declared Honorable Thad Eure, Secretary of State, at the conclusion of an hour's interview at his office Tuesday. This smears and recriminations, the secretary said would not engender in him or any senator, ill will, and that he would go on in the years that he would just as he has done in the past, and that he would not issue any statement on the subject.

## LT. ELLINGTON OF WINSTON- SALEM ONE OF VETS KILLED

First Lieutenants Richard W. Hall and Spurgeon N. ## "Strange" No Negroes Won Medal Of Honor Says Crisis Editor

New York — Declaring that President Truman has awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor "literally in batches" to white heroes of the war, The Crisis magazine editorially that it seems "strange to Negro Americans" that out one out of nearly a million of their men in the services should have won the nation's highest honor. The editorial in the December issue entitled, "Not One Out of a Million," follows:

Brave white heroes in our armed services have been awarded the nation's highest decoration, the Congressional Medal of Honor, literally in batches by President Truman. The Crisis would not take one ounce of credit from these men whose citations suggest that the honor they have won, high as it is, is not adequate thanks for their sacrifices and heroism. Yet it does seem strange to Negro Americans that out of the nearly one million of their men in the armed services not one should have performed in such a manner as to be cited for the Congressional Medal of Honor.
