DR. GRAHAM FAVORS STUDENT VOTE ORGANIZATION.
The most potent voice raised in defense of free assembly, free speech and the other freedom for which all have fought was the voice of Dr. Frank Graham, of the University of North Carolina, who in a statement made at the meeting on release to the press Sunday morning pointed to Dr. W. L. Pate and Bishop E. A. Penick as leaders and participants in inter-racial meetings and conferences. Dr. Graham said that he felt it his duty to make a statement since the administrative policies of academic freedom have been one involved.

The following is an excerpt: "We respectfully dedicate this book to the memory of the Honorable Thad Eure, Secretary of State, who is devoting his great talents and energy in promoting the well-being and progress of all the people of the great state of North Carolina." The excerpt was signed by Clarence Chavis, P. C. Weaver, E. J. Weaver, S. P. Hall and C. E. Robbins at Ahsokie.

It is revealed that there has been a very unfavorable representation concerning the use of Negro drivers and that the acceptance of these men by the other drivers to date has been favorable.

School Executive Comments On Atlanta School Situation

ATLANTA (ANP). — The School Executive, monthly magazine of the National Education association, comments editorially in the October issue on the public school conditions for Negroes as revealed in the Atlanta Urban League's report on public school facilities for Negroes in Atlanta. Dr. William G. Carr, chairman of the education policies commission of the NEA and the editor of the School Executive, wrote under the title of "An American Problem."

The educational disadvantages suffered by Negro children constitute a story that has been written and never has the story been better portrayed than in the recent report of the Atlanta Urban League describing the Negro schools of that city. Factual, concise, pictorial and impersonal, this document "presents the facts for all to see and ponder. Investments in school property is \$8 per white child, \$1 per white teacher, \$2 per pupil; for Negro teachers, 40 pupils Kindergarten are found in every elementary school for white children, not a single kindergarten for Negroes.

NAACP Polls Airlines On Jobs For Pilots

NEW YORK—Jobs for Negro pilots and ground crew members now being released by the Army Air Force are being sought by the NAACP which is conducting a poll of all domestic airlines in their present policies. It was announced here last week.

"We are making inquiry," said the letter, "whether you have formulated any plans, or contemplated doing so, regarding the use of trained Negro aviation personnel. While most Negro fliers were fighter pilots, a goodly number were trained in the operation of multi-engine aircraft, including navigation and radio."
