### Jackie Tells Fans Not To Applaud Too Much; Give Credit When Credit Is Due

NEW YORK (AP)—Lany, top-ranking sports writer, who holds forth on the pages of the sedate New York Herald Tribune, devoted his full column to human interest stuff about Jackie Robinson a week or so ago.

Lany had to say, he has said before, and will probably be said many times again, but a point of view of his editorially is being repeated. Pointing out that acceptance of Robinson has come about sooner than Jackie himself expected, Lany goes on to say, "The evidence is not all in yet but the indication is already clear that a Negro, if he is good enough, can play in the International League without causing the stars to fall. And it is that fact that there can be no good reason why he should not also play in the major leagues."

Baseball fans in any part of the country are a good natured lot of single-minded animals who through to murder umpires, and sell for the scraps of the opposing players, but they want the whole package done legal and sporting like. There have been instances of fans who have come to games over a fine point without a personal angle entering into the picture. What worries Jackie is something to be considered by the executive rather than shown him by the Negro fans. Whenever he has played the Negroes have made a point to applaud his every move as though it were the out of this world performance of a superman.

Talking to Lany about it, Robinson gave an instance. "In Newark, there was a big crowd, and thousands of them were Negroes. I was made nervous because they were too partisan to me. I thought, they cheered too loudly when I did just ordinary things. I think that is bad. I wish they wouldn't do it. It might make trouble in the stands."
