LOS ANGELES (AP) — According to reports, bandleader Lionel Hampton donated \$200 needed to secure a vacant office in the Negro district in which to open a campaign headquarters for Wallace Braden, Republican opponent to Helen Gahagan Douglas, congresswoman from the 14th district.

**Five Simple Checks For Starting Car Outlined**

Five simple checks which will give "starting assurance" for your car despite winter's freezing temperatures have been outlined by L. L. Pierce, national service director of the Ford Motor Company. They are:

1. Check the battery to see that it is in good condition, fully charged and charging properly.
2. See if the motor needs a tune-up to insure quick starting.
3. Drain the radiator, check all hose connections and add sufficient anti-freeze.
4. Change engine oil to the correct grade for the coldest weather you expect this winter.
5. In all but 1949 Ford models, change to winter grade in transmission and differential.

"Service statistics show that battery failure is the largest single cause of cars failing to start during winter weather," Mr. Pierce explained. "This necessarily doesn't mean the battery is worn out. It may only be discharged due to lack of maintenance or faulty connections.

"Because you can't get a replacement until the battery is fully charged, have your dealer put the battery on his automatically controlled fast charger. The charger will quickly charge the battery, usually in less than a half hour.

Batteries also should be checked for winter drying and motorists should make sure their tire tread isn't worn, as dangerously smooth they will make driving on icy roads doubly hazardous. Check the tires if an inspection indicates this is desirable.

"Driving slowly in cold weather, with the engine cranking normal operation temperature, Pierce advised. "Keep the fuel tank full as much of the time as possible to prevent condensation of moisture and resultant freezing-up of the gas line. A good plan is to fill the gas tank at the end of the day's driving, rather than at the start."

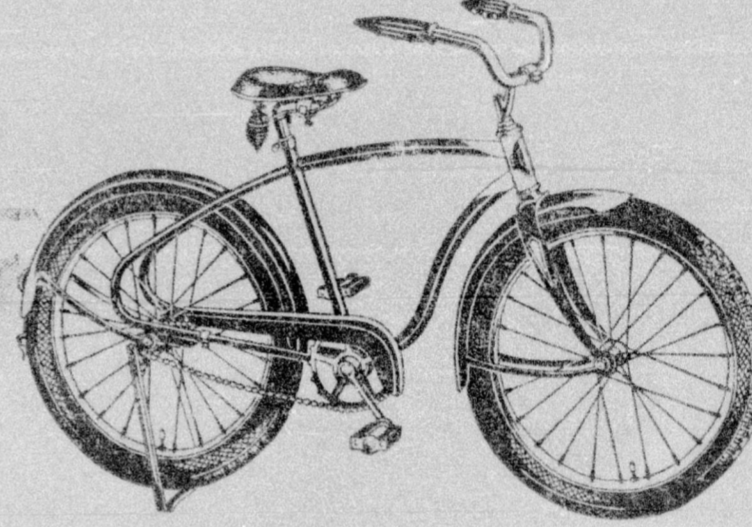

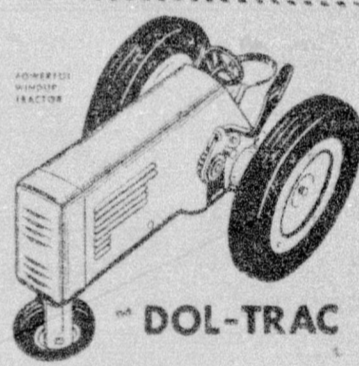

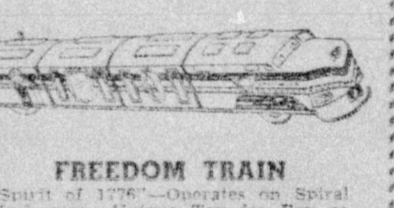
