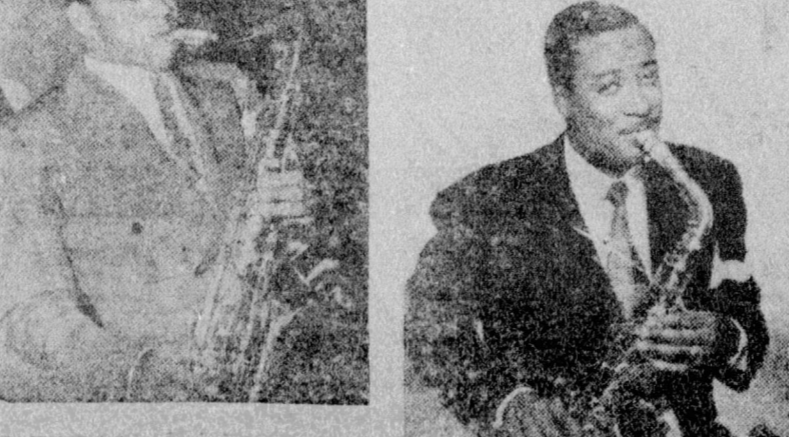

ALEXANDRIA, Va. (ANP)—A federal court has upheld the "no bias" order issued by the Federal Aviation Administration at the National Airport was upheld by a federal court in Alexandria, Va.
