



The survey was conducted by Billcoard mag, one of the country's top theatrical sheets, who pulled the record distributors in the 48 states to ascertain what artists and records were bought the most by the public last season. Twelve months ago Thompson was just another piano-playing leader with a desire to someday make the bigtime. Barnstorming throughout th hinetrlands with his band he was finally given a hance o record for Miracle record. His first session witnessed him cutting three standard tunes and Miracle officials at first frowned on him putting Long Gone on wax, but finally gave in under his persistence.


