



RUSTIN IN INDIA FACES N. C. JAIL TERM ON RETURN

India is giving a warm welcome to Bayard Rustin, one of the active figures in the Fellowship of Reconciliation, an internatoinal pacifist organization, Eayard, a New Yorker. spoke publicly here last Wednesday on racial intolerance in the U. S. and praised the Canadian creed of nonviolence.

In an attempt to show clearly how Argroes are discriminated against in the U.S., Rustin explained that on his return home next March, he will face a 30-day jail sentence on a road gang in North Carolina for riding in a section of a bus reserved for white people. He said the North Carolina Supreme Court upheld the sentence and that he was without funds to appeal to the U. S Supreme Court.

During his visit here, in which he has worn Indian dress much of the time. Rustin has been received by Prime Minister Nehru and has been a guest of Gov.-Gen. C. Rajagopalachari, at government house. Newspapers devoted columns to his speeches and to the Fellowship of Reconciliation. Rustin was also associated with A. Philip Randolph and Grant Reynolds on the Committee Against Jim Crow in the Armed forces.
