

# Racial Mixtures Are Interesting

HONOLULU (AP)—You soon learn that in Hawaii you can't tell an individual's ethnic origin by looking. Put most of the full-blooded Hawaiians and many of the part Hawaiians on 47th Street in Chicago, Lenox Avenue in Harlem or Auburn Avenue in Atlanta and you'd bet your last dollar they were Negroes.

The same goes for other peoples here, including many Filipinos, some Samoans, and even a few mixed Japanese and Chinese who are aware of no African ancestry. And of course there's no doubt the dark Puerto Ricans, even a smattering of Portuguese who

wish you hadn't asked.

In his rainbow land of beautiful color mixtures, it isn't always difficult to inquire about one's ancestry. But if you're anxious about anything, you're likely to be told, "You are half Chinese, one-sixth Hawaiian, one-sixth French, one-sixth Portuguese and one-sixth Puerto Rican." Sometimes it makes you wish you hadn't asked.

And yet despite this amazing and wonderful ethnic patchwork here in the "crossroads of the Pacific," there are prejudices. These are much more complex than those on the mainland where feeling is directed primarily against Negroes and Jews. Out here many dark Puerto Ricans are insulted if they are mistaken for Japanese, "convenience" which disgraced or deserted them when they returned to the mainland has not created a feeling of deep love and affection for haole.

groes were "no good," then when Black underworld characters showed up on the scene, they were pointed to as proof. They also used the table that all Negroes have tails" as one young colored woman graduate of a California university, round out personally to her utter amazement.

And yet the anti-Negro prejudice is not static by mainland standards. It is flexible and, for that reason, can be eliminated or allowed to survive largely by the efforts of Negroes themselves. As one young woman from an African organization told me, "We are the ones who are studying the color situation. We're telling the prejudice against Negroes exists not only because they are Negroes but because they are the most part 'haole' men," or haole boys and often are brought up with the same contempt as white haole coming from the mainland. In other words, we have the strange paradox of Negroes and haole being asked to respect each other.

This seems hideous. I do not know how many Negroes who have lived here for long periods of time have come to terms with other peoples more easily than with their own.

Even the Negroes themselves are not acculturated. There was another one Negro man who made friends all around married a white girl.

The fact that many white men have married Oriental or Hawaiian women for "convenience" which disgraced or deserted them when they returned to the mainland has not created a feeling of deep love and affection for haole.
