NEW YORK (AP) — RESEARCH — FATS — DIVIDENDS — Tom Melanau was born of slave parents back in Virginia in the early part of the last century. After gaining his freedom he took to the bare-knuckle prizefighting and became one of the most formidable exponents of his craft in the history of sports. Louis, no Lilly admired him. He fought Tom Cribb, considered the peer of all white pugilists of that period. One of their contests lasted 30 rounds under the rules of that day.

In the seconds' last hour basketball game of the season, the score was 69-62.

Don Ross scored eight field goals and seven free throws for 23 points to lead the Upsilon Upsilon, who took 25 out of 33 foul tries to move them off the Pirates' line set shooting. Hampton scored more baskets from the field — 27 to 22 — but could sink only 8 of 21 free throws.

Bill Wilson, who backed Ross 23 up with 16 points of his own, was another factor in the Union victory, as was Zeke Clement, with 12.

Union has won a berth in the CIAA tournament in Washington, March 17-19. Hampton with seven won and seven lost, was in the "doubtful" category after the loss.
