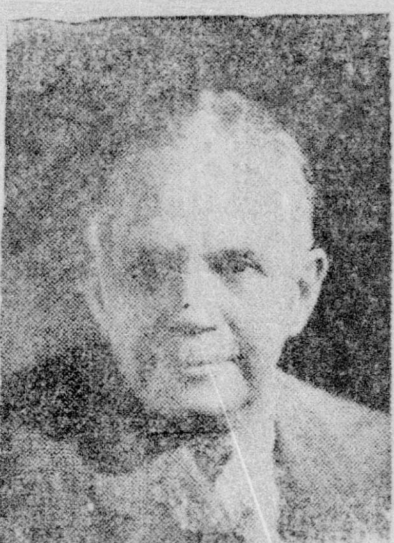

Negro Cited Among Top Minn. Citizens

Minneapolis, Minn. (ANP)—One Negro, Cecil E. Newman, 45, was voted as one of Minnesota's 100 living greats in a poll taken last week by the Minnesota Junior Chamber of Commerce. More than 10,000 ballots were cast in this vote.

Newman publishes and edits 2 Negro weeklies, the Minneapolis Spokesman and the St. Paul Recorder. He founded these two "Twin Cities" journals in 1934.

Along with 99 other Minnesotans, he was honored at a banquet attended by 1,000 persons at Coffman Memorial union on the University of Minnesota campus. The poll was taken in connection with Minnesota's centennial celebration.

Newman is a native of Kansas City, Mo. He came to Minnesota in 1922. He has worked as a bellhop, Pullman porter, reporter, editor, collector, and editor and publisher of his two papers.

He is a member of the governor's state Mental Advisory board and the Minneapolis mayor's council.
