Penitential and an exhibition of their original Shadowball infield workout will be tonight exhibited by the nationally famous Indianapolis Clowns, the Negro American League champions and baseball acrobats when they appear at Chavis Park, Raleigh on Saturday night, April 9, against the strong Raleigh Tigers at 8:00 o'clock in a regularly scheduled spring Inter-League exhibition contest.

The Clowns are famous for their side-line antics on the diamond that have made them so popular as the Zanyes of the Diamond, but to see some real major league AAA ball and ball handling, the fans will have to come to watch their unbelievable power tricks.

The shadowball exhibition will have the fans poring with interest as the infielders lineup in their regular positions (or some one else) and go through all the motions of holding an infield workout without the use of a baseball.

At first, fans believe that the ball is traveling so fast they cannot believe their eyes, but they soon realize that the Clowns are simply clowning again and sit back to watch and applaud with growing interest.

On the lighter side of the Clown comedy are the inimitable King Tut, Juggling Joe Taylor, a n a the irresistible (Gooch) Tatum. The antics of this trio are worth the price of admission alone, but to see a top flight baseball game along with the other numerable features is worth going miles to see. Advance reports indicate the Clowns have a number of surprises in store for their legion of followers.

HEFTY HITLER - That's diminutive Ray Neil, phenomenal hitting and fielding 25-year-old infield star of the famed Indianapolis Clowns Negro American Leaguers, who will be seen in action when the tumblers perform at Chavis Park on April 9 in an Inter-League game against the strong and mighty touted AAA Champs, Raleigh Tigers at 8 P. M. Neil has been with the Clowns since 1947 except during the war years when he served with the Army in the Merchant Navy Theatre of War. He was an All-star selection for the last two seasons in the East-West Classic staged annually before 45,000 at Comiskey Park, Chicago, as well as a pick for the All Star games at Polo Grounds, New York, and with the Kansas City Royals who scored victories over both Bob Feller's and the Bob Lemon-Gene Eardien Major League stars out on the coast the last two falls.



KING TUT - And we don't mean the Egyptian mummy either. This No. one baseball comedian is just about the funniest fellow to ever set foot on a diamond and he can still hold his own with most of the youngsters around first base, where he perches with the famed Negro American League Indianapolis Clowns.
