HIT REVERSAL OF VOTE RULE

RICHMOND, Va. - The United States Court of Appeals sitting here was asked today to uphold decisions handed down by Federal District Judge J. William Waring invalidating attempts by the Democratic party of South Carolina to exclude Negro citizens from membership in the party and from voting in the party primaries.

In an effort to obtain a reversal of Judge Waring and the validity of Baskin, chairman of the Democratic Party of South Carolina, to confer with other leaders of the party, filed an appeal, contending that Judge Waring was biased and should have disqualified himself. Such bias, Mr. Baskin and his associates alleged, was evidenced in certain remarks the judge had made at a meeting of the National Lawyers Guild in New York.
