On Monday night, May 15 a measure was to hold a special election May 21 to elect a board of free was passed by the state senate. The law was introduced by Rep. W. C. Taylor of Branche and passed handily by the house Friday, May 13 as the expiration date of the terms of the present board. The members will be elected from five districts into which the county has been divided: (1) Yanceyville Township; (2) Martin and Dan River Townships; (3) Elizabethtown and Locust Hill; (4) Story Creek and Anderson; and (5) Highwells and Leasburg. The remaining four on the board at present may seek reelection if they wish. Recently, Board members J. S. Watlington, who was added to the board by the first bill passed by Rep. Taylor, resigned during the storm of protest that followed the board's firing of the county school superintendent Holland McSwain.
