**Unable To Pay \$200 For Sewer, Woman Charged \$10 Fine**

JACKSON, Miss. (AP) — Where Mrs. Stevena Hilliard once had only one problem — that of raising \$200 to connect an open toilet into the city's sanitary sewer — she now has two. The second one was put in her lap last week by a municipal court judge, who fined her \$10 for violating the city sanitary ordinance.

Mrs. Hilliard, an aging woman, had been summoned in court for having an open toilet within the city limits. The judge explained the violation to her and asked her what she would do about it. Not having any money and not knowing where to get it, she said she was unable to have standard toilet facilities put in.

The judge said, "Sit tight. This laundry the woman 'one more baffling problem to solve."

# CHURCH GROUP TO MOVE QUARTERS

WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Fraternal Council of Negro Churches expects to move to its new headquarters in Southwest Washington next week. The Washington bureau closed its \$2,000 a year with a mass meeting at the Bible Way Church, Sunday evening.

The Council was organized 14 years ago in Rochester, N. Y., by Dr. L. K. Williams, who was then president of the National Baptist Convention of America.

The organization was founded for the purpose of developing a cooperative, all-race group among all colored denominations, and to take appropriate collective measures to strengthen this bond of Christian unity so that they might work together as one united church to bring about racial and economic justice, progressive measures of non-partisan political legislation and social reform.

Seeing the need of full time operation in Washington, the seat of the government, the Council established a Washington Bureau building, Dr. W. H. Johnson, the first director, and Miss Patricia Meyers, first administrative assistant.

Director of present duties, Dr. Johnson, gave up his office as director in 1949 and was succeeded by the Reverend C. T. Murray, who has recently been succeeded by T. M. Smith.

The organization is now composed of 11 Negro denominations with a membership of seven million people. One of these denominations has been asked to contribute to the purchasing of the \$10,000 headquarters in Washington. The Baptist will contribute \$2,000, A.M.E. \$1,500, A.M.E.Z. \$1,000, C.M.E. \$1,000, Christian \$500, Pentecostal \$250, Community \$200, Church of God in Christ \$200, and the Church of God and Saints of Christ \$200.

# ENTIRE CIVIL RIGHTS PROGRAM FACES DANGER

NEW YORK (AP) — The new coalition of Negroes and southern Democrats to defeat civil rights amendments to racial welfare legislation is a "dangerous development," Walter White, NAACP secretary, charged today.

White said the coalition "is a direct repudiation of the NAACP's long and unbroken commitment to federal legislation by which the South is being brought into the main stream of American life. This, despite the Supreme Court decisions invalidating state segregation laws and in the face of evidence that segregated education is being cracked in the South."

The NAACP executive director, Thurgood Marshall, said the coalition "expressed fear that enactment of these amendments would prove fatal to the bills. A Congress intent on passing this legislation could pass it with the protective amendment," Mr. White asserted.

"Rejection of these amendments," he said, "seems to indicate little possibility for the enactment of civil rights measures by this Congress. We are particularly dismayed by the curious logic which has impelled some favored opponents of civil rights to reject specific civil rights amendments. If these senators continue voting with the Dixiecrats, we will be unable to secure enactment of civil rights measures either as independent bills or as amendments to general welfare legislation."

# ATLANTA BANS KKK MASKING

ATLANTA (AP) — The city council here has passed a law which bans the wearing of masks in public except for festive occasions, an offense punishable by a fine of \$20 and 30 days in jail. The ordinance was approved 11-0 vote by the city council here last week.

The law was introduced by Archie Lindsey, who told the council that on the eve of its meeting a piece of plywood in the shape of a Klan hood bearing KKK initials and a cross was put on his front porch. He said later he received an anonymous telephone call "when said."

"For your sake and safety the Klan must not be run-rod," Lindsey said. "There are more U. S. Soldiers' Bonds outstanding today than since the end of the war."
