YOUR NATIONAL GUARD DIVISIONS CONTINUE THE OLD TRADITIONS

This is the twenty-fifth of a series on the Infantry and Armored Divisions of the New National Guard. They are presented to acquaint you with the organization which will be an integral part of the National All-Service Force, trained, equipped and available for immediate service with the Regular Army in the event of any emergency.

THE INFANTRY DIVISION - Now in organization but steeped in the traditions of the west in California's 49th Infantry Division under the command of Major General John U. Collins. It, although the division was organized in 1917 as part of America's blueprint for security—the new, post-war National Guard, the 49th has a proud and chequered tradition that dates back to the wild and woolly gold-rush days. The number of the division was selected in honor of the gold-rush days of 1849 which was the start of California's rise to statehood.

The 159th Infantry Regiment of the Division stems from companies originally organized in 1861 and consolidated into the 5th Infantry in 1887. It was redesignated the 8th Infantry, California Volunteers, when called to active duty during the Spanish-American War in 1898.

Again as the 5th Infantry it was stationed in Arizona during the Mexican Border Campaign in 1915 and finally evolved into the 159th Infantry Regiment in 1917 when called to duty for World War I. As part of California's famed 42nd Division, the 159th served in France and upon return sided in the organization of 184th and the 185th Infantry Regiments which now form the 49th Division.

In 1941, the 49th's 183rd, 184th and the 185th were called to active duty with the 40th Division. The 185th served with distinction in the Bismarck Archipelago and Southern Philippines actions. The 189th was assigned to the Regular Army's famed 7th Infantry Division, taking part in the Attu campaign. The 189th was joined by the 184th in 1943 in time to take part in the 7th's battle for the Ryukyus Islands and in the Southern Philippines campaign.

Thus these three regiments, which once formed the nucleus of California's 49th Division, again are united in the State's new contribution to the defense of our Nation.
