Political opposition to accomplish poll tax legislation came today by George W. Mason, counsel of the American Jewish Committee, and testimony submitted to the House Committee on Administration. "This action has long recognized that universal suffrage is basic to democracy," declared Mr. Mason, president of the American Jewish Committee, which Mr. Mintzler pointed out in the midst of a worldwide struggle to extend the freedoms of men and women everywhere we could. "The extension of millions of Americans because of the retention of the poll tax in several of our states."

"In the greatest democracy in the world more than ten million qualified citizens—seven million white and three million Negroes—are subject to government without a voice to bring it to the permanent form."
