In a letter to Maceo Hubbard of the Civil Rights Section of the Justice Department, Mrs. Constance Baker Motley of the NAACP legal department urged action on an earlier NAACP request for investigation of the murder for "possible violation of the Federal Civil Rights

Willie Johnson, the murdered on the evening of May 3 by man, was killed at eight o'clock two Brunswick policemen who charged that "he was looking suspiciously at a house." Johnson's wie, the NAACP asserts, was not notified of his death until the following morning.

Jolnson, 58 years of age, had been a resident of Brunswick for fourteen years, was a county employee, and was a leacon of St. Paul's Eaptist


