awakened when two unidentified men entered the house, took the keys and went upstairs to Hill's cell.

According to Tom Carswell, another Negro prisoner who was in the jail at the time, the two abductors entered the jail unlocked the cell and told Hill to come with them.

Carswell said that the men were unknown to him and that he would not know them if he saw them again because the cell was illuminated only by matches.

Sheriff Hatcher said that he learned from the roadhouse, where it had taken him about two hours to find his gun which had been thrown into the woods nearby. He had not looked in on Hill or the other prisoner, but had gone straight to bed.

As a result, he claimed, he did not know about Hill's absence until the next morning when he was called to identify a body which had been found beside a highway about three miles from the jail.

The body, badly beaten and with two bullet wounds in the head and one in the shoulder, turned out to be that of Hill. A coroner's inquest later reached a verdict of death by gunshot wound through the head by means unknown.

Governor Talmadge stated that ballistic tests would be made of the bullets recovered from the body and that every Georgia law enforcement agency is assisting the hunt for the killers.

Sheriff Hatcher claimed the young Negro was a minor that he had been killed by Hill.

SESSION URGED

No one expected support for the Truman program from the Dixiecrats. The coalition between Red and Dixiecrats was certainly not unexpected. But the anti-slavery and outright defection of some liberal Democrats was not anticipated.

The session began with the Senate not only refusing to uphold the Barkley riding on shutting off filibusters, but adopting a rule which abandons democratic process and establishes government by filibuster.

Unwilling or unable to half-adopt the measures which make a permanent civil rights program practically impossible, the administration at this session, administration leaders failed to support anti-segregation amendments to housing and education bills.

Now comes open abandonment of the whole program for this session. Mr. Truman still insists as of May 25, that he is for his civil rights proposals and will continue to press for them. The Republicans, who share the blame for the failures in this session, insist that the new filibuster can be passed under it and have challenged the Democrats to bring up such legislation for a test.

We therefore call upon the Truman administration to call a special session of Congress this summer for the purpose of acting upon civil rights legislation.

TRUMAN HEALTH

However, the rejection rate of North Carolina as a whole was 57 percent, whereas among draftees who had grown up in North Carolina orphanages and who had not too-expensive hospital and nutritional care plus sound but inexpensive nutrition, the rejection rate had been only three percent.

"Since the South's health problem is mainly an economy problem, a problem of the individual and family purchasing power for medical care," it said, "the solution is to put purchasing power for medical care into their hands. GI'S LIFE TERM IS REDUCED TO TWENTY YEARS

NEW YORK — The legal department of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People announced this week that it had been successful in its quest for reduction of the life sentence imposed by a court-martial upon former Private Eddie Brown of South Park, Atlanta. The sentence was reduced to twenty years.

In a petition for clemency submitted to the Secretary of the Army by Assistant Special Counsel Franklin H. Williams, the N.A.C.P. referred to Brown's consistently excellent character rating. The Association asserted that Brown's conviction for murder was "unlawful and unjustified" in view of the fact that the alleged murderer occurred immediately after he was assaulted by a white soldier after being refused admission, because of his race, to a dance hall. "The provocation of being unmercifully struck by a strange man," the NAACP petition stated, "undoubtedly aroused Brown's temper to such a heat that at the time he fired the fatal shot, he did not have any control of his reason."

In another action this week, Mr. Williams petitioned the Department of the Army to reverse the findings of a court-martial board which sentenced former Pfc. Dorita C. Abston to death for the alleged murder of a white woman in Germany. In the Abston case, the NAACP charged "even a cursory examination of the court-martial record" indicates that the conviction "was without justification in law or in fact."


