Tuskegee Gets \$100,000 For Hospital Buildings

Tuskegee Institute (ANP) - Contributions amounting to \$100,000 from the General Education Board and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis have been received here for the purpose of completing construction of buildings to house the School of Veterinary Medicine, President F. D. Patterson announced last week.

The Institute's president stated that work to complete the buildings using GI student labor and other building blocks of other materials, he stated, "we have effected economies which greatly reduced construction costs. At current prices, materials and labor, I doubt if our completed facilities for veterinary medicine could be duplicated for less than a million dollars."

The Tuskegee Institute School of Veterinary Medicine is one of four such schools in the south under contract with the Regional Council for Education to receive grants of \$30,000, plus aid for students selected by the several states which comprise the Council.

This year's 1949 graduating class included the first graduates using GI student labor and other building blocks of other materials, he stated, "we have effected economies which greatly reduced construction costs. At current prices, materials and labor, I doubt if our completed facilities for veterinary medicine could be duplicated for less than a million dollars."

JEWISH BOY SCOUTS GIVEN TWENTY ACRE CAMP SITE BY NEGRO

 ST. LOUIS—(ANP) - H. D. Robinson, prominent Negro spokesman, reported and discovered they had a vacant 20-acre tract they might use, and after some brief of land to a Jewish Boy Scout camp.

Previously, he donated a plot of land near his Toy estate to the Negro Scout troop of the St. Philip's Lutheran Church.

Jim Crow Clause Beaten In D.C. Bill

WASHINGTON (ANP) - Proof that the Republican-Dixiecrat coalition can be broken was exemplified in the senate last Tuesday when the Eastland-Johnson segregation amendment to the District Home Rule bill was defeated by a vote of 49 to 27.

The bill itself passed the senate by voice vote minus the anticipated filibuster. The only debate on the measure lasted about two hours and was on the amendment offered on the floor by Sen. James O. Eastland (D., Miss.) for himself and Sen. Olin D. Johnston (D., S. C.). The amendment provided for a referendum on any changes in the regulatory policy in the District of Columbia.

The Eastland amendment specifically stated that no ordinance of law designed to change any law, policy, custom, rule or regulation relating to racial segregation in the District of Columbia can become effective until it has been submitted by the Board of Elections to the qualified electors for a referendum at the first election to be held not less than 30 days after the date such ordinance is passed or such law is enacted.

This did not include nonsegregation in the public schools or playgrounds of the District, in recreational areas under the administration of the director of the department of recreation or in restaurants, hotels, places of amusement and other public places in the district.

The bill as it passed the senate gives qualified District residents a vote in choosing members of the city council and an elected school board. Nine councilmen will be elected and two appointed by the President. The bill does not provide for a vote for the President or congressmen.

It groups district agencies into 12 major departments under a city management selected by the council.

It preserves basic elements of congressional control over the district to be imposed by the Constitution.

Poll Tax Amendment Is Fraud Says NAACP

WASHINGTON— Branding the proposed amendment to the United States Constitution to abolish the poll tax as "a fraud on the American people," the NAACP urged the Senate Judiciary Committee, Leslie Perry of the NAACP Washington bureau said today. "Congress has a constitutional authority to enact legislation outlawing the poll tax in federal elections.

Moresover, poll tax being a controversial issue will encounter the same if not worse, difficulty in securing ratification by requisite state legislatures as did the child labor amendment passed by the 68th Congress which, after 25 years, has since been vetoed by the only states. Sincere foes of poll tax requirement rightly regard the Holland resolution as nothing less than a fraud on the American people."

Washington observers believe that both the Democratic and Republican will seize on the Holland resolution to "dodge" passing any effective civil rights legislation during the 81st Congress.

TEXAS HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS FRIGHTENED BY CULT LEADER

HOUSTON (ANP) - Reports that cult leader Elder Bonds had predicted a great catastrophe at the Whartley school here caused several hundred students to leave their classrooms in panic.

According to reports the cultist predicted that the school be blasted to bits because he was permitted to address the students about their "sins and transgressions." Later, when a dark cloud hovered over the building, terror broke out in classrooms.

Students reportedly jumped out of windows, broke through doors, jumped over fences, and ran wildly down nearby streets to avoid the "hex."

Mrs. E. Cunningham, dean of girls, said it was miraculous that no one was seriously injured. Assistant Principal William Moore said it was the usual type cloud that comes before a rain storm that frightened the students and it was hard to believe such a thing would cause an outbreak.
