TUTTLE CENTER SERVES ITS COMMUNITY

The Tuttle Community Center, a community chest agency closed its first six months of program this week with an outstanding record of service to the people in the community. The Center cared for an average daily attendance of forty-six pre-school children who enjoyed various activities, recreation, hot lunches, and a clean, comfortable bed for a nap each day after school. Twenty-six came directly from school and enjoyed the warmth and comfort of the center until their parents came from work. An average of seven-to-six boys took part in boys activities. Thirty children learned to make beautiful and useful things with their hands. Twenty-nine girls learned to spend their leisure time blending their voices in song. Over two-hundred adults came to the Center for relaxation by singing, playing games, and developing intricate skills. Three hundred and seventeen garments and eleven quilts were made plus many small articles. Twenty-two girl scouts made the center their home for work and play while five other troops used it for social recreation. Twenty-three low income families were clad with warm clothing and shoes at little or no cost.

The Bloodworth Street YMCA will sponsor a boys day camp at the "Y" during the summer months from 1:15 p.m. daily, officials of the "Y" announced. Designed to furnish constructive, fun-filled activities for boys 17, the activities will include arts and crafts, indoor games (table tennis, checkers, bowling, boxing), volleyball, softball, photography, movies, talent shows, story hours and discussion groups.
