CROP Food Helps Homeless Girl, 4.



Four-year-old Ursula Gramazork, one of the millions of refugee children in Germany, has no home of her own. But she does have some food every day. She gets it at the Grubweg church home, which is supplied from contributions which were made by American farmers in this and 25 other states to the Christian Rural Overseas program (CROP).

In the year ending June 1, a total of 75,668,581 pounds of farm commodities had been contributed for distribution in 22 of the 48 nations served by CROP's sponsoring agencies: Catholic Rural Life, Church World Service (22 Protestant denominations), and Lutheran World Relief. Gifts in kind included 28,775,504 pounds of wheat for 33% of the total, 22,061,357 pounds of corn for 28%, and 13,186,661 pounds of beans for 17%.

Meanwhile, plans are well advanced for extending the CROP drive nation-wide this year. Already, organizations have been set up in 20 states, and 11 others are in the process of organization for harvest season campaigns.

500 ATTEND SUMMER SCHOOL AT LINCOLN

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. — The largest registration in the graduate division since its inception in 1942 is recorded among Lincoln University (Mo.) students this summer. More than 500 students make up the roll which includes a large representation of in-service teachers.

The intersession six-week school has 46 teachers who must return to service before the close of the eight-week session, and who are pursuing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. According to an announcement from the Registrar's office there are also 511 in the regular session, and 21 in the vocational division.

The city supervised play grounds at School Street School Little Washington section and Greenleaf School North Goldsboro section got off with a good start during the past week with an attendance of 1,097 children the first week Greenleaf school. Mrs. Helen F. Harris and Miss Cleo Barnes, in charge registered 959 children School Street School. Mrs. Laura C. Smith and Miss Laura F. Foster in charge registered 741 children. A total of 253 children came to the sprinkling parties during the week.

All parents are invited to attend the event.

Activities on the play ground include handcraft, color painting, checkers, horseshoe pitching, soccer ball, softball, volley ball, three ball relay races, high jump, broad jump and various games.

The Play ground Softball and Baseball League will get under way during the week with four teams participating.

The participating teams are The Blue Jackets, Junior Pirates, Creek Street Yellow Jackets, and the Junior Torpedoes. Each team will play two games a week. Coaches and Captains of each team will be selected during the week.
