Blend thorough-Mix together 1 pound finely ground beef, I tablespoon marga-rine, % cup soft bread crumbs, % cup milk, 1 egg, well beaten, 1 tea-spoon salt, and % teaspoon pepper. Shape into 6 patties. Saute in 2 tablespoons margarine. Cut in half and toast hamburger rolls. Spread each generously with cheese mixture. Place cooked patties between balved rolls. Serve on plates garnished with pickle relish and ripe tomato slices. Makes 6. /
