2 BANDS TO APPEAR HERE IN A GREAT BATTLE OF MUSIC

There will be a battle of music between the bands of Roy Brown and Paul Williams at Raleigh Memorial Auditorium on Monday night, July 25th. Chubby "H.P. Shaking" Newsom will be an added extra attraction. Born in Louisville, Tennessee, thirty years ago, Paul Williams' earliest ambition was to spend the rest of his life in professional athletics. To achieve this goal while in high school he tried out for the Bowling Green Academy football team. The Coach took one look at him and said fella, "You're bigger than some other way to spend your spare time." Williams was heart-broken and spent the next few weeks stuffing himself with cake, candies and goodies trying to put on the necessary weight to make the team but all he managed to do was stuff himself sleek without gaining one single ounce.

Defected from football around 19 another school activity in which to part take. One of his friends said "Hey, why don't you try out for the school band?" Paul gave this a good deal of thought but then gave it up when he suddenly realized he couldn't play any instrument. He confessed his trouble to his music teacher who immediately took him under his wing and started to teach Paul how to handle the saxophone. Within three months Paul was one of the star members of the Bowling Green Academy band, and on his way to a career in the music business.

During the war the saxophonist devoted most of his time to the production of victory equipment. He worked at the Ford Motor Company's factories and moved from there to Whitehead and Kales, manufacturers of boat parts. His music, during the war, was confined to playing with the King Porter band at night.

It was in Detroit that Paul's first break came. He met the owner of a record shop named Joe Battles who delighted in the saxophonist's original instrumentalities. It was Joe Battles who introduced Paul to Teddy Reig, musical director of Savoy Records.

At Teddy's suggestion, Williams formed his own band and cut several sides for Savoy. Immediately the discs caught on. His "Hastings Street Bounce" was an overnight success in Philadelphia and on the basis of the records' popularity, Paul was booked in the famed Royal Theatre in Baltimore, Maryland.

Paul has never forgotten the friends who helped him get started. His second Savoy hit "30-30" is named after the address of Joe Battles' record shop in Detroit. And his latest disc "Bouncing With Bop-Non" is dedicated to disc jockey Al Benson, in Chicago, who was the first record spinner to recognize the varied talents of the versatile saxophonist-bandleader.
