COLUMBUS, O. (AP) — William H. Brooks, a local attorney, was the only Negro nominated to the Columbus City Council in a very tight vote at the primary elections held last week.

This marks the second time that Brooks has been a candidate for the council. In 1945 he won a place on the ballot in the non-partisan vote, but he did not win a seat.

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SWIMMING COURSE IS GIVEN FOR WENDELL

The first Negro swimming course ever to be held in rural Wake County will begin Monday afternoon, near Wendell and Zebulon, at the pond of Mr. Phil Whitley of Wendell.

The course, sponsored by the Wake County Chapter, American Red Cross, is being offered for the Negro population of that area. It will be taught by Negro Red Cross Water Safety Instructors from Raleigh, most all of whom have had considerable experience in teaching classes at Chavis Park Swimming Pool in Raleigh, and elsewhere.

The Negro Boy Scouts of Wendell, under the supervision of Mr. Earl Strickland, have volunteered to assist in cleaning up a portion of the pond in preparation for the class.

The admission to the classes is free. There is a minimum age limit of 6 years, but no maximum limit.

Instrumental in helping to organize this course were Mrs. Margie Ellis of Zebulon, Neoman Morgan of Wendell, and George Mitchell, Director of Chavis Park Pool in Raleigh.

Registration for the classes is being taken in Wendell at the store opposite the Negro High School and at Morgan's Barber shop also in Wendell. Mrs. Ellis is accepting registration in Zebulon at the Beauty Shop behind her residence.

Registration will continue to be accepted until Tuesday, August 16.

The schedule of classes all to be held from 5:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. as follows: Monday, August 15; Tuesday, August 16; Thursday, August 18; Monday, August 22; Wednesday, August 24; Friday, August 26; Monday, August 29; and finally Wednesday, August 31.

It is hoped that if there is sufficient interest in this class, and in swimming generally among the colored population in that area, some lake or pond can be developed for general recreational purpose by next summer.

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BLOODWORTH ST. YMCA CLOSES '49 MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

A total of 1024 members were enrolled and \$3516.00 of which \$19,350 in cash was raised in the 26th anniversary Street YMCA membership campaign which ended with a victory dinner meeting at the "A" on Friday night.

Final reports show that Division "A" led by Zack Ellis and C. H. McLeod, garnered 9897 points and Division "B" with 2021 points by A. J. Taylor and J. A. Mann. The executive sponsoring committee earned 6959 points and reported membership for 637 men and boys.
