Among the speakers today were Reverend E. Luther Cunningham, Minister of the St. Paul Baptist Church, Philadelphia; Reverend William Lovell, Minister of the South Congregational Church, Chicago; and Reverend Herbert S. Schroeder, Minister of the First Presbyterian Church, Yellow Springs, Ohio.

## ANIMALS INVADE AFRICAN TOWN

A search for water, made scarce by a long drought which has hit Africa from the Congo to the Cape, is bringing animals out of the jungle into towns. Last week, it was reported that a herd of 150 thirsty wild buffalo and a lone elephant approached the outskirts of this town.

Such an occurrence marked the first time in almost a century that wild animals have ventured in force near a populated area.

## VERDICT HIT IN COURT MARTIAL

NEW YORK — Protest against the denial of a review of the court martial conviction of former Private Albert W. Nolen was made this week by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in a letter to the Department of the Army.

In response to a letter from Col. Charles D. Carle, commanding officer in the Records Administration Center of the Adjutant General's office, informing Nolen that the Army had found no "reasonable doubt of your guilt," Assistant Special Counsel Franklin H. Williams of the NAACP asserted that the Army's decision "is shocking and deplorable in view of the facts and circumstances in this case."
