TEXAS NEWSPAPERS MARK 56TH YEAR


HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — This week The Texas Informer and Freeman published in Houston is observing its 56th birthday. This later.

Newspaper at 56 is one of the nation's oldest Negro newspapers.

It is the result of the merger of two famous old Texas newspapers. The Informer and the Texas Freeman. The Freeman was founded in 1833, and The Informer some years as the Informer.

Carter W. Wesley and J. A. Alkins, publishers, first bought The Informer in 1927 from C. F. Richardson. In 1939 they bought the Texas Freeman and combined the two into what is popularly known as the Informer.

Today the Informer enterprise is the largest Negro business in the Southwest. It hires more than 70 persons in its home plant. At the same time it runs three other newspapers, the Dallas Express, the New Orleans Informer Sentinel and the Shreveport (La.) Informer-Sentinel.
