## NTA MEETS AT HAMPTON INST.

HAMPTON, Va.—Specialists and leaders in the fields of architecture, building construction, engineering, and housing will convene at Hampton Institute Thursday, September 1, for a three-day convention of the National Technical Association.

Thursday's opening session, following the morning registration, will present Donald F. White, A. I. C., of Detroit, who is Association president; Julius A. Thomas, Director of the Department of Industrial Relations of the National Urban League, who will speak on "The Employment Outlook for Technically Trained Negroes;" and Hilyard R. Robinson, A. I. A., Washington, D. C., architect speaking on "Housing Today As It Affects Technicians and Other Trained Workers."

Ernest L. Dimitry, Eastern Vice President, will lead an open discussion after the addresses.

Slum clearance will be the prime topic for discussion Friday morning, with Frank S. Horne, Assistant to the Administrator of the Housing and Home Finance Agency in Washington, outlining the N. T. A.'s possibilities for participation in the national slum clearance bill. Leonard Hager, director of Standardized Building Codes and Materials in Washington, will follow with a discussion entitled "The Old Building Code Versus National Slum Clearance and Housing."

On Friday afternoon the group will tour the municipal buildings

and parks of Newport News, Virginia, with J. C. Biggins, C. E., the Newport News City Manager, conducting the tour.

Friday night's banquet, with Dean L. K. Downing, of the School of Engineering and Architecture of Howard University, as M. C., will present President Alonzo G. Moron of Hampton Institute, former manager of two Atlanta, Ga., federal housing projects as the main speaker. As Commissioner of Public Welfare for the Virgin Islands Mr. Moron laid the basis for a large-scale housing program there.

Saturday's two main addresses, morning and afternoon, will present respectively Dr. Henry J. E. Reid, Director of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, at Langley Field, Va., who will speak on the N. A. C. A.'s progress; and Charles S. Duke, of the U. S. Engineer's Office in the Virgin Islands, who is founder of the organization. Mr. Duke will come all the way from his home to present "A Three-Point Program for the National Technical Association."

## GETS LAND GRANT

WIERTON, W. Va. (NIPS) — The presentation of a deed to a building lot by a local industrialist was observed in recent ceremonies in this industrial town, making available additional recreational facilities for residents. The industry head, Lewis Reese, owner-operator of the Solo-Ohio Pottery, turned over the deed to Dr. A. J. Major, principal of the colored high school of Wierton.

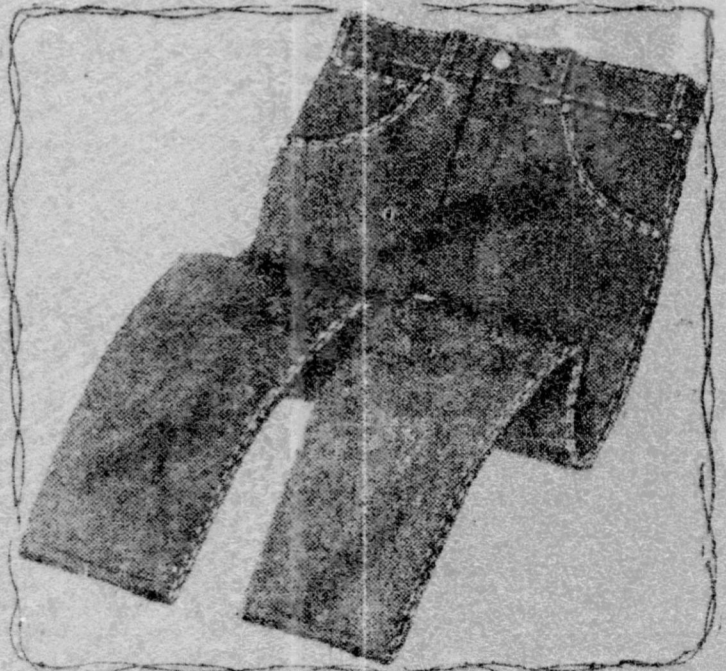
