SCOUTING IN WAKE

THE NATIONAL ROLL CALL

The time set apart over the nation for ROLL CALL OF TROOPS

This is the time for scouts and sctoners to give to the sponsoring institutions and to the public an account of their stewardship for the past year.

At the appointed hour the scouts, sctoners and scton committees are to be on hand at some public gathering of the sponsoring institution and give a complete report on each individual scout. This should include his rank, advancement, merit badges, camping activities, and other things that show his progress and his participation in scouting during the year. Another name for this is Charter Review. And it is the duty of the sctonmaster and scton committee to prepare this report. Be sure to have it ready.

Every boy should be on hand looking his best — in uniform if he has one. Some one designated by the Invitational Committee will be on hand to check the standards and progress of the troop.

If you are not familiar with what the troops are doing, start doing this is the time to have your eyes opened.
