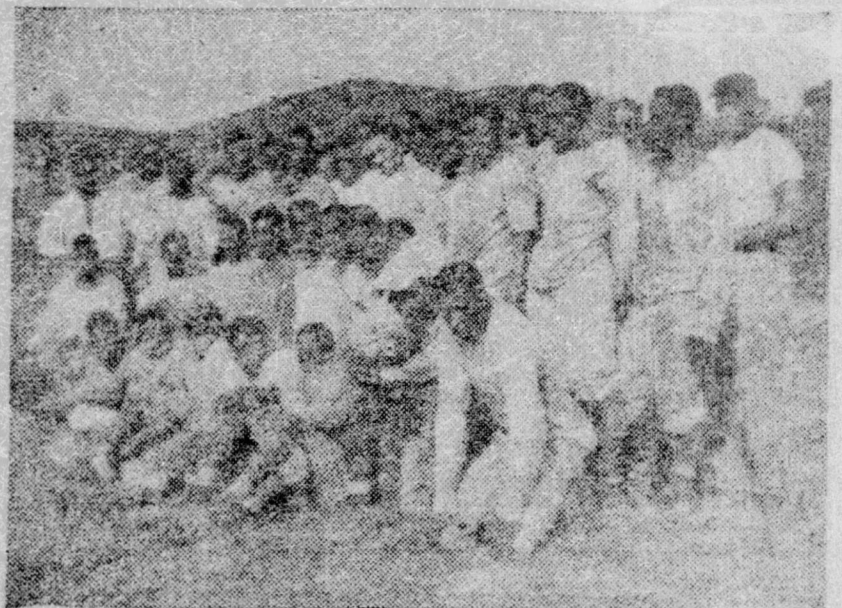


# GOLDSBORO

### JAIL CHECK FORGER AFTER 4-MO. SPREE

**CHICAGO (ANP)** — A 23-year-old Chicago youth found last week that everything has its ending — even something that almost reaches perfection, Robert Evans, after four months of perfect check forging, was placed behind bars at Erie-well municipal jail on a charge of forgery and burglary.

Officials described Evans as a perfect forger. Through the use of a stolen check protector and a flexible penmanship he was able to cash checks at grocery stores and currency exchanged amounting to a sum of more than \$500. He passed 12 checks drawn on the Chicago National bank.

Bank officials told detectives the signatures were so perfect that they were a long time detecting the fraud.

**Ronoke Rapids, N. C. (ANP)** — Two men from Northhampton County were injured last week while engaged in a rifle-icepick fight. Both men were hospitalized and face indictment on charges of assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and inflicting serious bodily injury.

The men were Roscoe Mitchell, who was shot with a .22 caliber rifle, and Alfred Squire, stabbed in the right side with an ice pick. The fight was said to be the result of a series of arguments between the two men.
