DURHAM — Ten thousand spectators are expected to witness North Carolina College's Homecoming contest against the Tigers of Virginia State College this Saturday.

The 22nd Airborne Artillery Detachment and Military Band of Fort Bragg, Fayetteville, N. C. will participate in a parade early Saturday morning along with Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Safety Patrols and other band units.

Miss North Carolina Scenic will be crowned during half-time ceremonies. Alumni, friends and faculty and staff members will attend an evening dance at the W. Z. Hill Community Center, climaxing the day's activities.

A round-trip ticket to the Capital Classic in Washington on November 11, when the Eagles meet West Virginia State, will be given to the alumnus selling the highest number of advance tickets to the homecoming contest.

The Smith Golden Bulls came back a few plays later to score on an off-tackle play. McCullough kicked the extra point, and Smith led 7-6.

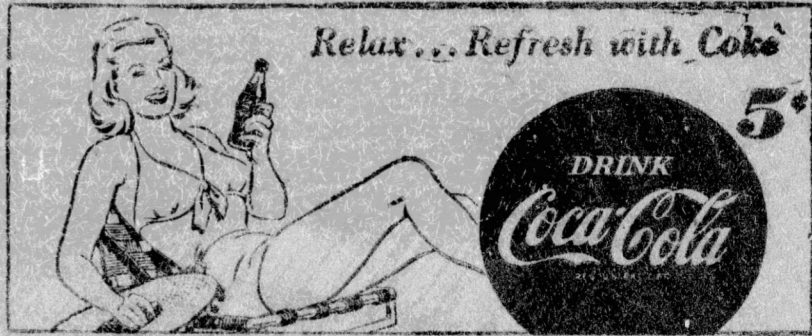
