## N. Y. NAACP ATTACKS COMMIE CHARGES

NEW YORK, N. Y. — Because the New York Branch of the NAACP has criticized failure of the Nominating Committee of the National Office for their failure to renunciate Judge Jane M. Bolin for the Board of Directors and because the Executive Committee of the New York Branch for stated reasons has requested the National Board of Directors to ask for and accept Mr. Walter White's resignation, the Branch has been charged with Communist infiltration.

Except for this ridiculous charge of Communist infiltration the arguments supporting the position of the Branch remain unanswered. The Executive Committee of the

making and legislative body of the organization and if Communist influence exerts itself, it will have to be in this body. The New York Branch will appreciate any one identifying any member of its Executive Committee as a Communist. Until that can be done, the person or persons who attempts to smear the Branch must be branded a vicious person or persons and a despicable liar.

Whatever action has been taken by the Branch independently or with other organizations has been accomplished with the approval and endorsement of the Executive Committee.
