While employed on the Courier stiff. Graves reported all news of national interest, mainly political. He traveled with President Truman or his Caribbean tour which included the Virgin Islands. He also traveled with Gov. Thomas Dewey on his special campaign trip through the West.

Before coming to the Courier. Graves began his newspaper work with the Carolina Tribune, worked for 12 years with the Journal and Guide of Norfolk, Va. During which time, he worked in almost every capacity offered in the newspaper business, but his duty was mainly that of a sport's editor, From 1943 to 1945 he served as war correspondent for the Journal






