One of the most disgusting occasions confronting us today is a small group of young boys, between the ages of 7 and 12 that play upon the sympathy of strangers by asking for 5 or 10 cents to buy food.

Most of these children are seen Saturday morning and Sunday afternoon between the Carolina Theatre and the Post Office. They are begging shoe shine boys. They are doing their best to beg and do practically anything they are large enough to do.

Most of them come from the area of Evans Hill and Durham Street. They are very embarrassing to all of us.

We had the occasion to observe this group in action Sunday afternoon in the space of 15 minutes these boys made exactly 12 requests for funds, and 12 pairs of shoes to shine.

This may seem odd but there is a law in the city that prohibits the shining of shoes without a license. The majority of the law is nebulous, but my group does not deal with with interpretation of the law. These young children are the future "generals" of the city, they are the ones that give the tourists the wrong impression of our group.

These same young fellows can be made clean and taught to lead decent and industrial lives. The trouble with them is that they haven't had the training at home, Sunday school and church hold no interest for them or their parents.

Sometimes along the line there has been so little contact with the church or any organization.

## HOWARD TEACHERS ATTEND MEET

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Seven Howard University science teachers made outstanding contributions to the Annual Regional Meeting of the National Institute of Science held last week at Virginia Polytechnic College.

Particularly interesting to the chemistry teachers were two papers delivered by J. W. Hugley, Instructor in Chemistry at Howard University. One of Mr. Hugley's papers gave a New Mendeleev Scheme for the Activity Series of the Common Metals, while the other summarized "Visualized Methods of Presenting Chemical Theory." These papers offered a simpler and more easily learned approach to the mastery of complex chemical theory.

Dr. R. E. Field, head of the Department of Zoology at Howard University, demonstrated "Abundance of Microscopic Slides" during the Demonstration Clinic sessions and Prof. D. T. Ray of the same division demonstrated "Blood Testing."

Contributions from Howard's Physics Department were made by Dr. Herbert Branson, who explained "Contact Printing, Enlarging and Making Lantern Slides," and Mr. W. N. McInosh, who demonstrated preparation of "Scattering Metal Films," and the splitting of films.

Mr. J. W. Hugley, in collaboration with James E. Johnson, Jr. showed "A New Apparatus for the Teaching of the Theory of Electrolytic Dissociation," and in collaboration with Dr. S. R. Cooper, Mr. Hugley demonstrated "A New Apparatus for the Determination of Total Water in Silicate Rocks." This latter device will speed up analysis made in the ceramic industries.

## Dixie Paper Backs Frat Discrimination

CHARLESTON, S. C. — Some of the young affiliates of Northern colleges are trying to "doish" "doish" discrimination," says the "News and Courier" of Charleston, the South's oldest daily.

These colleges are offering to admit students of Greek letter fraternities that exclude more than white members, says the Courier. But the Negro "Leaders and Progressives" demanding the opening of Lodges of white Miners, Knights of Pythias, Elks and Odd Fellows to Negroes.

The effort to destroy the chapters of white students in colleges, the Courier goes on to say, is preparatory to a campaign to break down fraternal orders of white men.

The hope and expectation of these professors is that they can "educate" these white men and women while they are students to remove all race separation which they shall be adult citizens.

**Pancake Day**



Back in Merry old England in the 12th century Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent begins, was celebrated as "Pancake Day." The old custom is still observed in England, Canada and parts of the United States. The order of the day is a feast of fluffy golden pancakes.

In celebrating Pancake Day, or any other special occasion, try Pancakes Adirondack. **Pancakes Adirondack**

PANCAKES:  
2 cups ready-mix for pancakes)  
2/4 cups milk

FILLING AND TOPPING: Melted butter, shaved maple sugar, whipped cream.

Just add milk to unsifted ready mix all at once and stir lightly. Pour 1/4 cup batter for each pancake onto a hot, lightly greased griddle. Bake to a golden brown, turning only once.

Stack three pancakes placing melted butter and shaved maple sugar (or brown sugar) between each. Top with whipped cream; sprinkle with shaved maple sugar. Makes 14 to 16 medium pancakes.
