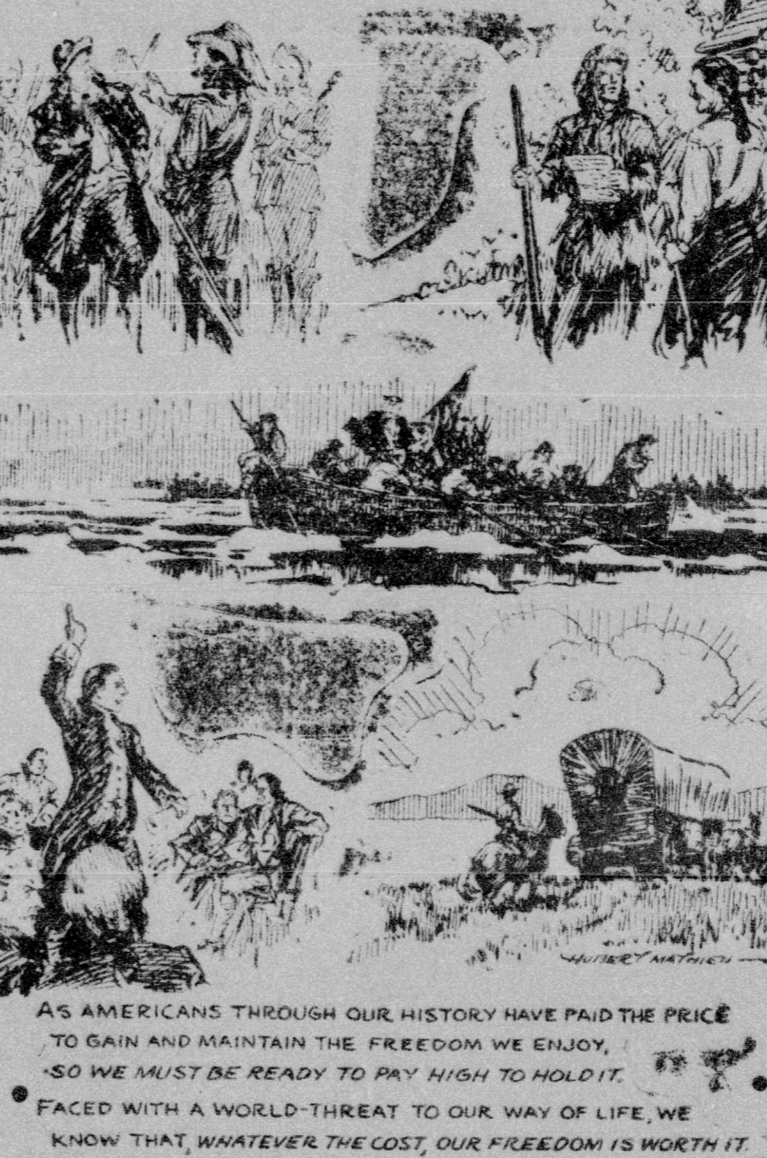

The Red lead plane made a feint attack on the left, while the others had peeled off and were coming in for an attack in the rear.

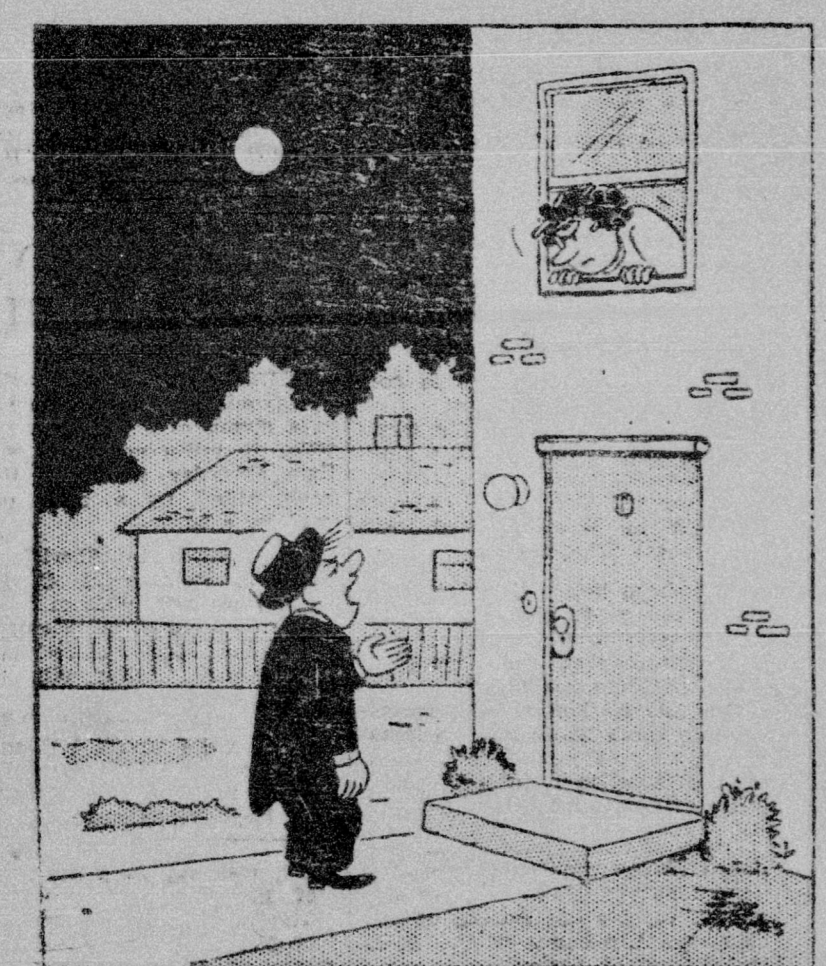
He reached down with his left hand and turned the oxygen valve fully open. He could feel its knurled knob twist easily between his able fingers.
